Happening Local Volunteer Councils—the heart of



I n 1993 the Alabama Legis-lature created the Individual & Family Support program. Managing the program was assigned to local volunteer councils (Community Support *Councils*) and 5 regional councils (Regional Support Councils). A State Council was also created to serve as a forum to link all 5 regional efforts. Council members must be parents of children with developmental disabilities or adults with developmental disabilities.



There are over 14 million children with special health care needs under 18 years of age in the United States.

One in five families with children across the U.S. has at least one child with special health care needs.

These children experience 4 times the number of hospitalizations, 7 times the number of yearly doctor visits, and 5 times the number of prescriptions.
